Praise to you, O God, our salvation who is near.


You hold us in our waiting and keep us awake to the world.

We trust that even though we do not know the day or the hour, you hurry to gather all people to your peace.







Into your hands O Gracious God, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your mercy, through Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**





Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us.


Our Father, who art in heaven,
