

OPPORTUNITIES FOR ACTION

The Social Ministry Committee realizes that with all the changes we are seeing in Ohio and statewide, members and friends of Christ Lutheran might be looking for ways to respond in constructive ways. Here are a few suggestions:

Let our legislators in Washington and Columbus know what we want from our government.

This is a good time to participate in Bread for the World's annual Offering of Letters (www.bread.org/offering-letters). A sample letter to be typed or copied by hand is listed there, along with a link to an email that can be modified and sent to our Congressman and Senators. The emphasis for the campaign this year is to restore funding for USAID programs around the world and fully fund the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC). Printed copies with Legislator addresses are on the table under the bulletin board in the Narthex.

Donate to local non-profit organizations addressing hunger and homelessness.

You might buy boxed pasta or cereal, canned vegetables, soups, and fruits for the Athens Food Pantry, to leave in the shopping cart in the Narthex. Or you could purchase items needed by Good Works to leave in the container under the table in the Narthex. Here is a partial list of items Good Works needs for the people they serve:

- Gift cards from: McDonalds, Wendy's Taco Bell, Arby's, Walmart, or Kroger,
- Toilet paper, paper towels, napkins, or masking tape,
- Hand towels (for bathroom and kitchen) or Plastic gloves (to handle food),
- Zip-lock bags (all sizes), flea collars for dogs and cats (for Sign of HOPE), or
- sanitizing/Clorox wipes.



APRIL 2025 WAVE OF PRAYER

International Women's Day on March 8 is a chance to celebrate women and the contributions of women around the world. However, a gender pay gap still exists worldwide, at around 20%. This means that women earn around 80 cents for every dollar earned by men. Many factors contribute to this reality. Fortunately, the gap has narrowed in recent decades, especially in middle and high-income countries. Efforts to further narrow the gap globally continue.

God, we thank you for the women in our lives who have impacted us personally in countless ways. We pray that the efforts to decrease the gender pay gap may show good practical results around the world and that all women may be honored. Loving God, we offer you our prayer.

Nearly 800 women die each day from complications of pregnancy and childbirth (about one death every two minutes). Maternal mortality rates vary widely across countries and regions. In 2020, 70% of maternal deaths, which are mostly preventable with good health care, happened in sub-Saharan Africa.

God, we pray for pregnant women in both developed and developing countries, that they may live to care for their children and enjoy their families as mothers and grandmothers. We pray that all women may have access to good health care. Loving God, we offer you our prayer.

As armed conflicts continue in Ukraine, Gaza and tens of other sometimes lesser-known places, the flow of military weapons continues in full force. Hundreds of billions of dollars trade hands every year as countries and individuals buy, sell, and donate weapons of destruction.

God, the amount of money and the number of weapons given to fuel violence around the world is staggering. It is mind-boggling. We cry out to you, oh God, for this to end. We cry out to you, longing for peace. We long for Isaiah's prophecy to come about, when swords and spears will be turned into plows and pruning hooks. How long, loving God, must we wait?

An estimated 2.5 million Americans have a serious gambling problem, an addiction similar in nature to drug or alcohol addiction. The Supreme Court overturned a ban on sports betting in 2018, and today, sports betting is legal in 39 states. Last year, it brought in revenue of 14 billion dollars. Gamblers Anonymous and other programs seek to assist those who would like to recover from their addiction.

God, we pray for every person with a gambling problem. If life has become unmanageable and they would like a way out, may they find the treatment that might help them. We thank you that hope exists with supportive programs and people. Loving God, we offer you our prayer.

Between the 16th and 19th centuries, around 12,000 ships participated in the slave trade, forcibly transporting millions of Africans to the Americas. Like Tara Roberts, author of Written in the Waters, I know the names of some ships that traveled to the Americas, like the Mayflower and the Titanic. Yet I do not know the name of a single slave ship. I also did not know that about 1.8 million Africans died when around 1,000 of those ships sank in the crossing.

God, we thank you every time we gain awareness into a missing part of history—history of our own ancestors and history of many other people who have lived on this earth. May we honor those who walked before us by knowing their stories. Loving God, we offer you our prayer.
